Evaluation Report on DLG-funded Other Programmes (Gifted Education) 2013 – 14

Title:	The Piloting Scheme for Secondary Schools – The HKUST Dual Programme & Other tertiary educational institutions – programmes for secondary school students
Objectives	To subsidise programmes for the accelerated learning and independent learning of high-achievers and/or potentially gifted students especially at science and mathematics.
Deliverables	1. Pre-stage courses in Mathematics & Physics & Level 1 in Mathematics, Physics, Chemistry & Life Science
Target	36 F.2-F.4 students participated in Pre-stage & Level 1 courses; 2 students participated in Level 2 of Dual Programme of the HKUST; 7 elite senior form students for summer camps
Selection mechanism	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Students for HKUST programmes were nominated by Science, Mathematics & Class teachers based on <ul style="list-style-type: none"> -their potential and ability in respective fields; and -their motivation and self-initiation 2. Students for summer programmes were nominated by class teachers.
Duration and venue	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. About 17 lessons in 6 months A 3-hour lesson weekly held on Saturdays in the HKUST 2. 3-day summer camps in Engineering and Business (HK Poly U & CUHK)
Evaluation	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. For Dual Programme of HKUST, 22 students (20 students successfully completed Pre-stage & Level, while 2 students successfully completed Level 2 among 38 students); 2. Having satisfactory result, 11 of them were eligible to be promoted to higher level of Dual Programme by HKUST; 3. Among them, 4 received Distinction results and 6 of them had successfully applied for Level 2 courses in 2014-15. 4. One of them in Level 2 Mathematics was selected by HKUST to represent Hong Kong for mathematics competition in Singapore in May 2014. 5. Participants of the summer camps reported satisfactory programmes organized by Poly U & CUHK.
Expenditure	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. HKUST Dual Programme: HKD19,965 (subsidy of course fees for 36 students); 2. HK Poly U Engineering Summer Camp: HKD1,200 (subsidy for 4 students) 3. The CUHK Elite Business Camp: HKD1,650 (subsidy for one student)

Title:	Reading and Response Gifted Programme
Objectives	1. Cater for students who have exceptional reading proficiency 2. Cater for students who can eloquently express themselves
Deliverables	2. One assignment every two lessons 3. Students take part in open competitions
Target	F.4-6 (10-20 students from each level)
Selection mechanism	2. Students nominated by English language teachers based on 3. Motivation and diligence 4. The performance in English language exam
Duration and venue	3. 30 lessons in 10 months 4. A 1.5-hour lesson weekly held in classrooms of the school (after-school / school holidays)
Evaluation	6. The attendance of students was high. (over 80%) 7. Students joined various book report and story writing competition and were commended by the judges. 8. Students have made continuous improvement in terms of reading speed and the ability to express their ideas as reflected by the results in tests and exams. 9. It is recommended to offer similar programme next year but the group size should be smaller to give participants more individual attention.

Title	Debate Workshop
Objectives	1. To enhance students' critical thinking and debating skills 2. To enhance confidence in public speaking
Deliverables	1. More students will be interested in joining debating competitions.
Target	20 students
Selection mechanism	20 students were nominated by their English teachers based on their interest and ability.
Duration and Venue	1. Three 3-hour training sessions were organized by a debating expert. 2. The workshop took place in Rm 321 of CSWCSS.
Evaluation	1. The attendance of students was satisfactory, with an average of 80%. 2. Students were actively involved in the debating activities. 3. More students were introduced to debating and some later joined the school's English debating team.
Expenditure	HK\$ 8,100 (Hiring a native teacher from Headstart and provision of learning booklets)

Title	Drama Enrichment Programme
Objectives	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. To enrich students' theatrical experiences 2. To develop students' talents in dramatic productions
Deliverables	1. Students develop creativity and skills in dramatic productions.
Target	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Three F.4 classes of better English ability were subsidized to watch the drama <i>Thirty-nine Steps</i>. 2. 10 enthusiastic students were subsidized to watch <i>Dunsinane</i>.
Date and Venue	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. F.4A, 4B and 4C attended the drama show in Sai Wan Ho Civic Centre on 12/3. There was a pre-show talk by the main actor to introduce the play. 2. 10 students and 2 teachers went to watch <i>Dunsinane</i> on 2/5. The NET gave a pre-show introduction about the play and its historical background.
Evaluation	Students' response to <i>39 Steps</i> was overwhelming positive. The pre-show activity was also very effective in arousing students' interest in drama. Ten students were introduced to a full play of professional acting, costumes and music in Kwai-Tsing Theatre.
Expenditure	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. \$2,600 (3 coaches hired to take students to Sai Wan Ho Civic Centre) 2. \$594 (Subsidy for 108 students' ticket) 3. \$1,400 (12 tickets for <i>Dunsinane</i>)

Title	Training for Public Speaking
Objectives	To improve students' public speaking skills
Deliverables	Students get better results in public speaking (solo & team) in the Speech Festival
Target	F.4 and F.5 contestants for public speaking
Date and Venue	3 training sessions were held by ex-students before the Speech Festival in the school.
Evaluation	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Students benefited a lot from the training. 2. The results in the Speech Festival were good, with 1 champion and 1 Third in Senior Public Speaking Team. 3. A mass lecture can be organized using in-class time to reach a wider audience.
Expenditure	\$700 (Hiring of ex-students to assist in coaching)

Title	Chemistry enrichment workshop - Chemistry Quiz organized by HKPU - Australia Chemistry Programs etc. Dual program with University
Objectives	- To broaden the horizon of Chemistry Students To subsidize programs for independent learning of high-achievers
Deliverables	Students show more interest in get better results in open competitions.
Target	Three Form 4, Form 5 and Form 6 chemistry elective classes of better Science Ability and students enthusiastic about Chemistry
Date and Venue	8 weeks in April and May in school. 1 1/2 hours per session.
Evaluation	1. Students benefited a lot from the training programme. 2. The results Australian National Chemistry Quiz were good, with 17 High distinctions, 16 distinctions and 17 credits. Excellent results were also obtained in the Open Quiz organized by HKPU. 3. More students will participate in Dual program organized by HKUST.
Expenditure	Hiring of ex-students to assist in coaching Subsidize for Australian National Chemistry workshop
